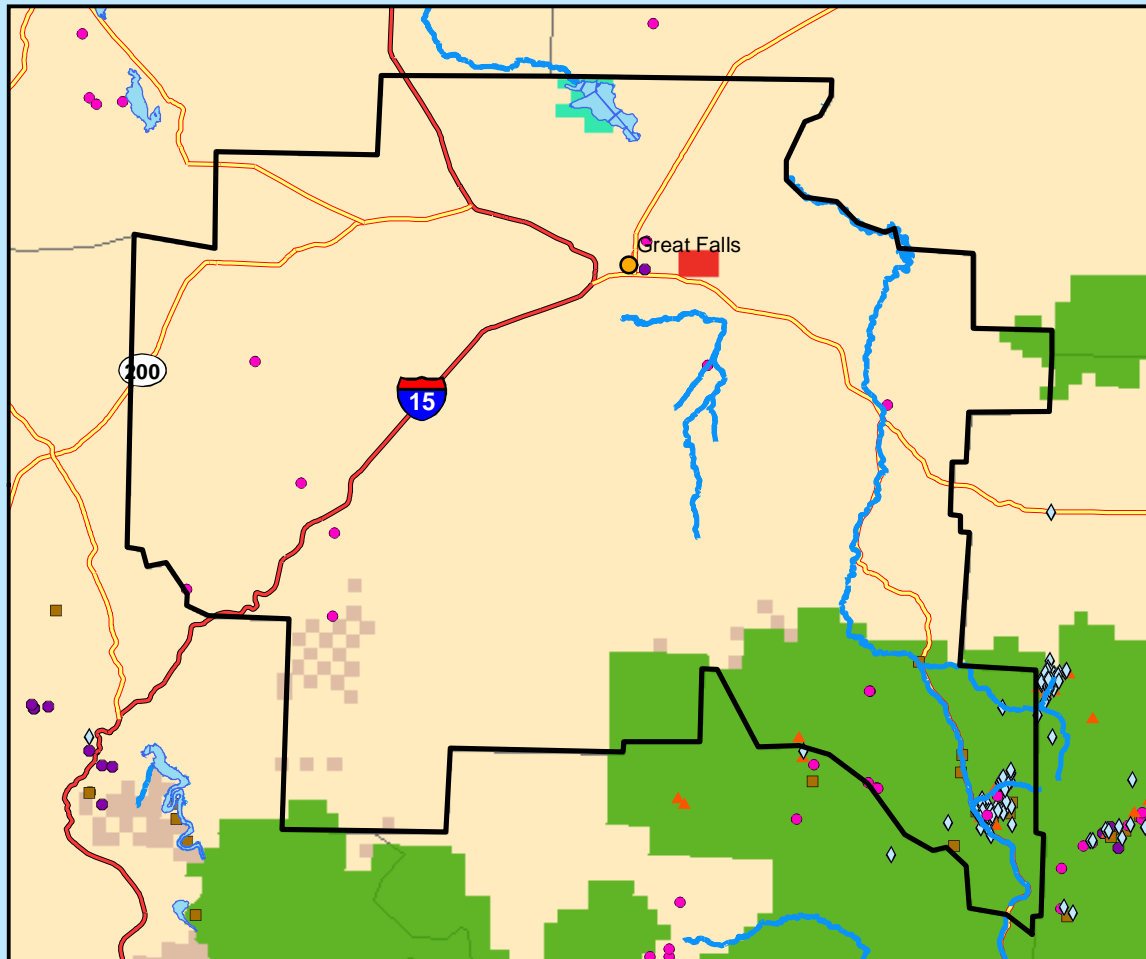


# Abandoned Hardrock Mines and Waters Polluted by Metals
