A Growing Threat THOUSANDS OF TAILINGS MINE WASTE SITES ACROSS THE WORLD





What are tailings? Tailings are finely ground muddy or sandy mine wastes left behind after the valuable metals and minerals have been extracted from the ore. Industrial-scale mining generates billions of tons of tailings waste every year worldwide. Mine tailings can also create extensive damage when the dams that hold them in place fail and release a powerful wave of waste and contaminated water that destroys communities and ecosystems. As shown below, the 2015 collapse of the tailings dam at the Samarco mine created a flash flood of tailings that covered houses in the town of Bento Rodrigues, Brazil.
